Home visiting:

1,321

slots for DC families

Home visiting programs provide education and other family supports to families who are expecting or already have young children.

Quality Improvement Network (QIN):



400

slots for infants and toddlers

The QIN increases the number of slots and access to high-quality child care, early learning and family engagement services for infants and toddlers.



147,525

books mailed to children < 5 since 2016

The Books From Birth program mails all enrolled children in DC a free book each month from birth until they turn five.

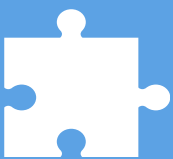
Children enrolled in public preschool & pre-K:
